

Notifications Relating to Tobacco Products

1st -30th June 2024

Under the WTO's Agreement on Technical Barriers to Trade, member states for valid reasons are allowed to regulate markets, protect their consumers, preserve their natural resources, using tools such as rules for product weight, size, or packaging; ingredient or identity standards; shelf-life restrictions; and import testing and certification procedures.

However, often these measures result in perceived discrimination against imports in order to protect domestic industries.

The TBT Agreement seeks to ensure that standards, technical regulations, and conformity assessment procedures are non-discriminatory and are applied on a non-discriminatory basis.

This Newsletter captures NTBs notified by WTO members and their relevance to Tobacco products for June 2024. It also highlights the potential impact of these NTBs on India's exports.

TBT Notifications Issued by WTO Member Countries

The various WTO Member countries issued 265 TBT notifications during June 2024. Of these, only 8 notifications are relevant to tobacco.

Country-wise Break-up of NTB Notifications




Figure 1 Distribution of TBT Notifications Against Tobacco Products

Review of TBT Notifications relating to electronic products for the month of June 2024 reveals that out of the total 8 notifications, Finland issued the relatively largest number of Notifications relating to tobacco products, 2, followed by Canada (1), Lithuania (1), the Philippines (1), Slovenia (1), the UAE (1), and the UK (1), respectively. See Figure 1 for the distribution of TBT notifications against tobacco products.

Potential Impact of TBT Notifications on Tobacco Products

Data analysis reveals that Notifications issued by the WTO Member countries in June 2024 could potentially affect India's exports worth US\$ 0.33 million if appropriate measures are not taken to resolve these issues in time.

At the country level, data review reveals that out of the total potential decline in India's exports, Finland alone would account for a decline of over US\$0.26 million, followed by Canada at over US\$0.07 million. India does not export any of the products to the markets of Slovenia, UAE, UK, Lithuania, and the Philippines.

Table 1 describes Notifications and product-wise exports from India to these countries in 2023.

These regulations define single-use electronic cigarettes as devices that: • are not rechargeable, not refillable or are neither rechargeable nor refillable, and • vaporise substances (other than tobacco) for the purpose of inhalation through a mouthpiece. The restriction will not apply to single-use electronic cigarettes that: • are refillable by means of a refill container, or tank or single-use cartridge, and • are any of the above and rechargeable. Breach of these prohibitions will be an offence under the regulations. The regulations provide for fixed monetary penalties, variable monetary penalties, compliance notices and stop notices as well as non-compliance penalties.
